23 must-see London exhibitions during Frieze Week

Frieze London and Frieze Masters are set to open in London on October 11, but there's plenty more for art lovers to see beyond the main fairs...

ctober is the undisputed high point in the London's calendar, as Frieze, PAD, 1-54 and other fairs arrive in the capital. But the action is not exclusive to the tents (or, in 1-54's case, Somerset House.) Christie's – whose façade has been made over for the week by Lakwena McIver - and Sotheby's have got major auctions, and their pre-sale exhibitions give us rare opportunity to see works that more usually reside in private homes. Then, there are the commercial galleries and institutions who are putting on shows that can, quite literally, take your breath away with their beauty. What's more, there's a strong interiors bent to some of them. Here's our pick of the best.

Susan Weil: Breaking Glass, at Sundaram Tagore Gallery

Susan Weil was part of the New York School alongside Cy Twombly, Elaine and Willem de Kooning, Jasper Johns, Robert Rauschenberg (to whom she was briefly married) and others. This exhibition at Sundaram Tagore, SW7, traces her seven decade-long career, showing figurative, portrait and landscape works alongside some of her iconic blueprint series which are part of the permanent collection at MOMA in New York.
